Rotary World Peace Fellowships

Clubs in District 7770 are encouraged to seek out well-qualified candidates for 2011 Rotary WorldPeace Fellowships. Peace Fellows are leaders in promoting world understanding, peace and conflict resolution through their lives, in their careers, and through service activities. They can earn a master's degree (15-24 month course) or professional development certificate (3-month course).

General eligibility includes the following:

- A commitment to international understanding and peace, demonstrated through their professional and academic achievements and personal and community service activities
- Bachelor's degree or equivalent in a related field with strong grades at the time of application
- Minimum three years' combined paid or unpaid full-time relevant work experience for the master's degree program
- Minimum five years' relevant work experience with current full-time employment in a mid- to upper-level position for the certificate program
- Proficiency in second language for the master's program or proficiency in English for the certificate program
- Excellent leadership skills

The following persons are ineligible for Rotary World Peace Fellowships:

- a) a Rotarian, an honorary Rotarian;
- b) an employee of a Rotary entity;
- c) a spouse, lineal descendant (child or grandchild by blood or legal adoption), spouse of lineal descendants, or ancestors (parent or grandparent by blood) of any living person in the categories (a) or (b); and former Rotarians and their relatives as described above within 36 months of resignation.

Some exceptions may be granted for the professional development certificate. Persons with disabilities and Rotaract members are encouraged to apply.

Application materials will be available in January, 2010. Clubs are responsible for promoting the fellowship opportunity, interviewing applicants, and submitting endorsed application(s) to the district World Peace Chair by May 1. The district will interview and select a candidate for submission to RI World Headquarters. The Rotary Foundation and Rotary Centers select fellowship finalists and notify the districts and candidates in November/December.
